Here are some of the most common irregular verbs in English, their present and past tense verb forms and their past participle form:

Infinitive	Present Simple	Past Simple	Past Participle
<b>to be</b>	I am she is they are	I was she was they were	I have been she has been they have been
<b>to begin</b>	I begin she begins they begin	I began she began they began	I have begun she has begun they have begun
